Cutting Instructions


29167-41	1 rectangle, 2″ x 3 ½″ ★ 2 rectangles, 1 ¼″ x 2″ ★	A B
29162-19	1 strip, 2" x 15"	С
29164-11	4 squares, 1 ¼″ X 1 ¼″ ★ 1 strip, 2″ x 15″ 4 squares, 3 ½″ x 3 ½″	D E F
29164-21	2 borders, 1 ¾" x 9 ½" 2 borders, 1 ¾" x 12"	G H

In each of the monthly patterns, you will have the option to simplify the block.

For this month, if you wish to eliminate the pieced center, do not cut pieces
A,B, or D. Replace these pieces with
(1) square of the background fabric cut at 3 ½" x 3 ½".

Your completed block would look like this:



Look for the \bigstar throughout the pattern for instructions to make the simplified version.

block construction


RST=right sides together use a ¼" seam allowance read through all instructions before beginning

★ If you are opting to make the simplified block, skip to step 3.

1. Sew a **(D)** background square to each end of an x-print **(B)** rectangle. Press seams toward **(B)**. Make 2. These units will each measure $1 \frac{1}{4}$ x $3 \frac{1}{2}$




2. Sew the two units made in step 1 to the top and bottom of an x-print (A) rectangle. Press seams toward (A). The center unit will measure $3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $3 \frac{1}{2}$ ".



3. Sew together the red print (C) strip and the background (E) strip. Press toward (C). The strip unit will measure $3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 15".



4. Cut the strip unit into 4 segments; each measuring 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".




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
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 \bigstar If you are making the simplified block, substitute the 3 ½" x 3 ½" background square in place of the center unit made in step 2.



6. Sew **(G)** borders to the sides of the block and **(H)** borders to the top/bottom. Press all seams away from the center. The completed block measures 12" x 12".

Note: This measurement is correct. It is not the standard $12 \frac{1}{2} x 12 \frac{1}{2}$ measurement we often see.
