This month, construct (1) Sunny Friendship Star.


Cutting Instructions

29167-41	1 square, 1 ½" x 1 ½" ★ 2 squares, 2" x 2" ★	A B
29162-19	2 squares, 4" x 4"	С
29164-11	2 squares, 2" X 2" ★ 4 squares, 1 ½" x 1 ½" ★ 2 squares, 4" x 4" 4 squares, 3 ½" x 3 ½"	D E F G
29164-21	2 borders, 1 ¾" x 9 ½" 2 borders, 1 ¾" x 12"	H I

In each of the monthly patterns, you will have the option to simplify the block.

For this month, if you wish to eliminate the pieced center, do not cut pieces
A,B, D, or E. Replace these pieces with (1) square of the background fabric cut at 3 ½" x 3 ½".

Your completed block would look like this:



Look for the \bigstar throughout the pattern for instructions to make the simplified version.

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block construction

RST=right sides together use a ¼" seam allowance read through all instructions before beginning


★ If you are opting to make the simplified block, skip to step 3.

1. Mark a diagonal line across the back of a background **(D)** square. Place the **(D)** square RST with an x-print **(B)** square. Sew 1/4" away from each side of the marked line. Cut the unit apart on the drawn line. Press the seam toward **(B)**. You will have two half square triangles.

Trim each half square triangle to $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $1 \frac{1}{2}$ ". Repeat to make 4 half square triangles.




2. Sew together the 4 half square triangles, 4 background (E) squares, and 1 x-print (A) square as illustrated to create the center unit. Press as illustrated. The center unit will measure $3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $3 \frac{1}{2}$ ".



3. Mark a diagonal line across the back of a background **(F)** square. Place the **(F)** square RST with a red print **(C)** square. Sew 1/4" away from each side of the marked line. Cut the unit apart on the drawn line. Press the seam toward **(C)**. You will have two half square triangles.

Trim each half square triangle to $3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $3 \frac{1}{2}$ ". Repeat to make 4 half square triangles.






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
4. Lay out the block pieces as shown below. Sew together and press as illustrated. The block now measures 9 %" x 9 %".


 \star If you are making the simplified block, substitute the 3 ½" x 3 ½" background square in place of the center unit made in step 2.



5. Sew (H) borders to the sides of the block and (I) borders to the top/bottom. Press all seams away from the center. The completed block measures 12" x 12".

Note: This measurement is correct. It is not the standard 12 $\frac{12}{2}$ x 12 $\frac{12}{2}$ measurement we often see.
