




Galaxy Star


Like so many of us, I absolutely love the design of so many different star blocks, from the classic, simple ones to the most intricate feathered stars. This GALAXY STAR block is one of my favorites that I have used several times over the years because it uses a few techniques and because of the fabulous secondary pattern it creates when used on its own. 

8	1 ½" squares (A)	2 ½" squares (A)
8	1 ½" squares (B)	2 ½" squares (B)
2	3" squares, cut in half diagonally (C)	5" squares, cut in half diagonally (C)
2	2 ½" squares, cut in half diagonally (D)	4" squares, cut in half diagonally (D)
2	2 ½" squares, cut in half diagonally (E)	4" squares, cut in half diagonally (E)
1	2 ½″ square (F)	4 ½″ square (F)

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


Piecing Instructions

Step 1

Lay out 2 A squares and 2 B squares as shown. Sew together to make a checkerboard four-patch unit.

Repeat to make 4 A/B four-patch units measuring $2\frac{1}{2}$ (6" block) or $4\frac{1}{2}$ " (12" block).



Step 2

Place a D triangle and an E triangle right sides together as shown. Make sure you have aligned your triangles along the straight edge, not the longer bias edge created from cutting the D and E squares in half!

Join the triangles to make a D/E unit. Press seam to the darker print.

Repeat to make 4 D/E units.

Step 3

Place a D/E unit and a C triangle right sides together as shown. Make sure you align the bottom straight edge of your D/E unit with the bias edge of your C triangle.

Note: Your D/E unit will be just a little larger than your C triangle.


Join to make a split QST.

Repeat to make 4 split QSTs. Trim QSTs to 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ (6" block) or 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (12" block).

Step 4

Lay out four-patch units, split QSTs, and F square as shown. Join units to make the full block. Trim to $6 \frac{1}{2}$ or $12 \frac{1}{2}$.
