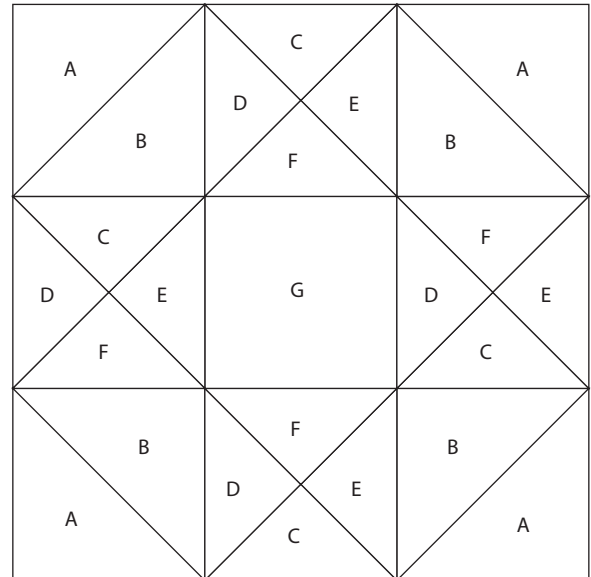

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Cutting Instructions

Qty	6" finished block	12" finished block
2	3" squares (A)	4" squares (A)
2	3" squares (B)	4" squares (B)
1	3 1/2" square (C)	5 1/2" square (C)
1	3 1/2" square (D)	5 1/2" square (D)
1	3 1/2" square (E)	5 1/2" square (E)
1	3 1/2" square (F)	5 1/2" square (F)
1	2 1/2" square (G)	4 1/2" square (G)

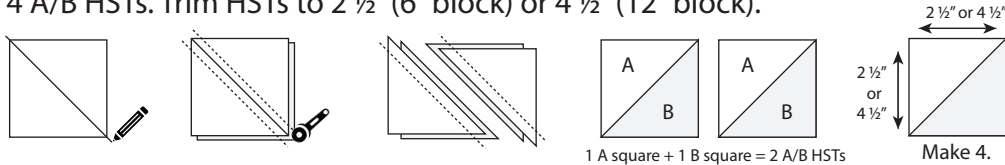
Piecing Instructions

Step 1

On the wrong side of each A square, draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner as shown.

Place A and B squares right sides together. Stitch a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on both sides of the drawn line. Cut the square apart on the line to yield two HSTs, and press the seams to the darker triangles (B).

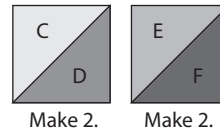
Repeat to make 4 A/B HSTs. Trim HSTs to $2\frac{1}{2}$ " (6" block) or $4\frac{1}{2}$ " (12" block).



Step 2

Using the C, D, E, and F squares, repeat Step 1 to make 2 C/D HSTs and 2 E/F HSTs.

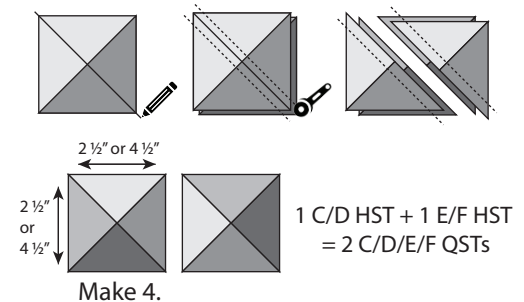
Press to the C and F triangles; do not trim.



Step 3

On the wrong side of each C/D HST, draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner as shown. Place a C/D and E/F HST right sides together so that the seams nest. Stitch a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on both sides of the drawn line. Cut apart on the line to yield two QSTs, and press the seams open.

Repeat to make 4 QSTs. Trim QSTs to $2\frac{1}{2}$ " (6" block) or $4\frac{1}{2}$ " (12" block).

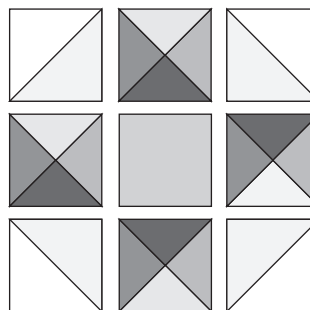


Step 4

Lay out HSTs, QSTs, and G square as shown.

Join units to make the full block.

Trim to $6\frac{1}{2}$ " or $12\frac{1}{2}$ ".
