

Easy as Cake 52" x 64"

A free pattern brought to you by Corey Yoder of Coriander Quilts featuring Coriander Colors & Coriander Seeds fabrics

Fabrics Needed

- 1 Coriander Colors Layer Cake (you will use 20 squares)
- 1 1/3 yards black print fabric for star points
- 1 3/4 yards background fabric
- 1/2 yard binding fabric
- 3 1/2 yards backing fabric
- 60" x 72" piece of batting

Cutting Instructions

wof = width of fabric

Choose 20 squares to use from the Coriander Colors Layer Cake

Tip: A Layer Cake has (40) 10" squares included. If you double the black print yardage and the background yardage, you will have enough fabric to create 2 quilt tops.

From each of (20) 10" Layer Cake squares cut:

(1) square, 8 1/2" x 8 1/2" (A) [20 squares total]

From the black print fabric cut:

(8) strips 5 1/4" x wof; subcut (52) squares, 5 1/4" x 5 1/4" (B)

From the background fabric cut:


- (4) strips 9 3/4" x wof; subcut (13) squares, 9 3/4" x 9 3/4" (C)
- (4) strips 4 1/2" x wof; subcut (30) squares, 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" (D)

From the binding fabric cut:

(7) strips 2 1/2" x wof; trim selvages and sew end to end to create continuous binding

From the backing fabric cut:

(2) pieces 61" x wof, sew the pieces together to form the backing







Block Construction

RST = right sides together use a 1/4" seam allowance press as illustrated read through all of the instructions before beginning

- 1. Draw a diagonal line across the back of 4 black print (B) squares. Place two (B) squares RST with a background (C) square as illustrated.
- 2. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line.
- 3. Cut the unit apart on the marked diagonal line. You will have 2 partial flying geese units. Press toward (B).



- 4. Place a marked (B) square RST with a partical flying geese unit as illustrated.
- 5. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line.
- 6. Cut the unit apart on the marked diagonal line. You will have 2 flying geese units. Press toward **(B)**. Repeat with the remaining partial flying geese unit and marked **(B)** square.



- 7. Trim the flying geese units to 4 1/2" x 8 1/2".
- 8. Repeat to make a total of 52 flying geese units (49 will be used).






Quilt Top Construction

- 1. Lay out the the print (A) squares, background (D) squares, and flying geese units as illustrated.
- 2. Sew the pieces together in horizontal rows. Press away from the flying geese units in each row.

3. Sew the rows together to complete the quilt top. Press in one direction.



Finishing the Quilt

Baste the quilt top, batting and backing fabric together using your preferred method. Quilt as desired and bind using the 2 1/2" prepared binding strips.
