


Not Quite a Sawtooth Star 12" Finished Block

Fabrics needed to complete 1 block

- (8) pink squares, 3" x 3" (A)
- (1) agua square, 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" (B)
- (4) white rectangles, 4" x 5 1/2" (C)
- (4) white squares, 4" x 4" (D)

- 1. Draw a diagonal line across the back of 2 pink (A) squares. Place a marked (A) square right sides together on one corner of a white (C) rectangle. Sew on the marked line. Press the top square so it forms a triangle and all raw edges of the block are aligned. Trim out the bottom two layers of fabric leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Leave the top layer intact.
- 2. Place a marked (A) square right sides together on the opposite corner of the (C) rectangle as shown. Sew and trim as in step 1 to create an almost flying geese unit measuring 4" x 5 1/2".



- 3. Repeat steps 1 & 2 to create 4 almost flying geese units.
- 4. Sew together the almost flying geese units along with the (B) center square, and the 4 (D) corner squares to create the Not Quite a Sawtooth Star block. The completed block will measure 12 1/2" x 12 1/2".
